READ 1 JOHN 2:28

What part does shame play in your relationship with God? What part should it play?

TUESDAY

READ 1 JOHN 2:29

What is the "right" thing referred to in this passage?

Write out your own definition of righteous.

Who, today, needs you to share what it means to be God's children with them?

WEDNESDAY

READ 1 JOHN 3:1

How well do you think the world knows you?

List several things that God has done to shower you with love.

In what ways do you need to shower other believers with Love?

Study Tips:

- Pray before you start. Jesus is called the Word so how better to know Him that to study the word? Ask Him to help you understand and know Him better.
- Highlight and note. Don't be afraid to note your victories and struggles in your Bible. Highlight passages that are especially meaningful to you. These may be a great help later when you need them.
- Look up related passages. The time you invest in understanding the Word as a whole will multiply your devotion and faith. Go Deep!

READ 1 JOHN 3:2-3

What do you think will change about you upon Jesus' return?

Do you live with an eager expectation of His coming? Why or why not?

What area in your life needs the most attention to be more pure?

FRIDAY

READ 1 JOHN 3:4-6

List the hope and the despair found in this passage.

Would you consider verse 6 good news or bad news? Why?

Pray and ask God to reveal the sin that needs to be dealt with.

SATURDAY

READ 1 JOHN 3:7-10

Is it possible to not be "in sin" and yet still sin? Explain.

Do you think the church is good at loving one another? Are you?

What can you do to express a proper thankfulness for the debt that was paid on your behalf?
