MONDAY

READ NEHEMIAH 7:4-73

Compare this to how heaven might appear one day,

Why do we find it hard to work with out fellow believers sometimes?

What do you need to return from after being in exile?

TUESDAY

READ NEHEMIAH 7:74-8:1

What do you think "as one man" means in this passage?

Do you see the church as one? Why is that?

List what you could do to promote being one church.

WEDNESDAY

READ NEHEMIAH 8:2-3

When have you been hungry enough for the word to listen like this?

How long might you listen? What else would you wait for like this?

What would make the church have this kind of desire today?

DIVE

Study Tips:

- Pray before you start. Jesus is called the Word so how better to know Him that to study the word? Ask Him to help you understand and know Him better.
- Highlight and note. Don't be afraid to note your victories and struggles in your Bible. Highlight passages that are especially meaningful to you. These may be a great help later when you need them.
- Look up related passages. The time you invest in understanding the Word as a whole will multiply your devotion and faith. Go Deep!

THURSDAY

READ NEHEMIAH 8:4-6

Do you ever consider who God is enough to be driven face down?

Why do you think believers don't often react like this?

How comfortable are you with God? How casual are you?

FRIDAY

READ NEHEMIAH 8:7-8

Do you take the time to make sure others understand the Word?

How might people react when we care enough help them get it?

What understanding has God given to you that you need to share?

SATURDAY

READ NEHEMIAH 8:9

Explain why you think all the people had been weeping over the law.

What is your usual reaction when you see your condition to the law?

Ask God to open up the law and reveal what you should do next,
