MONDAY

READ NEHEMIAH 2:1-2

If your face expresses your heart, What do others see?

What breaks your heart? Are you emotional about temporal things?

Write out why you should be full of joy. Live in these things today.

TUESDAY

READ NEHEMIAH 2:3

How can this city represent our spiritual lives?

What is the condition of your city and its gates today?

How today can you work to rebuild your city? What needs most work?

WEDNESDAY

READ NEHEMIAH 2:4-5

What is your attitude when you approach God with requests?

Do you hold God to a high esteem? Is it enough? What's He deserve?

Be in awe of your King everyday, but start today!

Study Tips:

- Pray before you start. Jesus is called the Word so how better to know Him that to study the word? Ask Him to help you understand and know Him better.
- Highlight and note. Don't be afraid to note your victories and struggles in your Bible. Highlight passages that are especially meaningful to you. These may be a great help later when you need them.
- Look up related passages. The time you invest in understanding the Word as a whole will multiply your devotion and faith. Go Deep!

THURSDAY

READ NEHEMIAH 2:6

Do those in authority over you delight in rewarding your service?

What journeys has your king sent you on lately?

What work should you be seeking to journey to?

FRIDAY

READ NEHEMIAH 2:7-9

When on your mission, what do you request that God will provide?

What should you ask for that you do not? Why don't you?

Today ask God to supply specific needs and thank Him for it.

SATURDAY

READ NEHEMIAH 2:10

Who might be disturbed at your spiritual growth?

As you grow, what might our enemy do to slow or stop it?

Today, pray for provision and protection in your spiritual journey.
